		The Convenor, Mr. Zaccheddu (DE), opened the meeting and welcomed the members.
		Concerning the Decisions of the 30 th UNGEGN relating to this Working Group (WG TDFG) the <i>Convenor</i> informed that all activities had been tackled and accomplished.
11:05	2	Liaison with international standardization bodies (ISO, OGC, Unicode)
		• ISO The Convenor explained that most documents of the International Organization for Standardization's Technical Committee 211 Geographic information/Geomatics (ISO/TC 211) were addressed to general geographic information issues. He particularly referred to the update of ISO/CD 19112:2017(E) - Geographic information – Spatial referencing by geographic identifiers. This standardization process has not yet been accomplished and will be further monitored by the WG TDFG. Generally he emphasized again to get in touch with national representatives in ISO, OGC to make aware of GN issues and in order to be informed about draft standards.
		UNICODE Ms. Cheetham (UK) informs the WG TDFG about the latest UNICODE version 11.0.0, published on 5 June 2018. This version supersedes all previous versions of the Unicode Standard. She proposed to invite UNICODE to the next UNGEGN Session in April 2019.
		Task 1: Invite UNICODE to the next UNGEGN Session in April 2019 → Cheetham (UK)
		Task 2: Clarify how to get in touch with ISO in order to contribute to the ISO Language Codes Technical Committee → Convenor and Bureau
11:15	3	Liaison UNGEGN with UN-GGIM
		The <i>Convenor</i> recalled the presentation within the Symposium, Session 4: International standardization "Support of geographical names data files and gazetteers to UN-GGIM activities and 2030 Agenda". In that presentation the collaborative activities, UNGEGN's areas of work and the way forward concerning future opportunities for collaboration with UN-GGIM were touched on.

		The Convenor thanked the European UNGEGN experts for their expertise provided for commenting and discussing a draft recommendation for content of the theme 'Geographical Names' within UN-GGIM: Europe Work Group on Core Data in 2017/2018. Furthermore, the Convenor highlighted that UNGEGN shall further contribute to UN-GGIM's Working Group on Fundamental Data Themes.
11:35	4	Activities of the WG
		Training Courses in Toponymy The Convenor informs the WG about the Training Course in Toponymy that had been arranged in the Philippines in spring 2018. The WG invited to consider a participation and contribution to the Training Courses in order to share the responsibilities and time. Mr. Gammeltoft (Convenor of the Working Group on Toponomic Training Courses) stated that an interest by Indonesia for conducting another training course has been raised.
		Support of UNECA's Geonym application The Convenor informed the participants that a letter to UNECA was sent in January 2018 and that a positive response by UNECA was received in February 2018.

		 The following short presentations (see attachments) were held: Toponym gazetteer system of our country's new address system of the Republic of Korea, Young-Hoon (John) Kim Merging standardized and non-standardized gazetteers – A case study for transboundary named entity recognition (NER), Gerhard Rampl
12:10	6	Discussion forum within the WG website / Online discussion forum
		The <i>Convenor</i> provided information about the Online Discussion Forum ¹ and presented its current content and some functionalities. Amongst others, the UNGEGN and UN-GGIM – Relationship as well as the support of UNGEGN to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) had been added as additional forums 4 and 5. Furthermore, he reported that only few input has been provided so far on the UNGEGN and UN-GGIM – Relationship and no input or remarks has been received to the old topics in the discussion forums 1, 2 and 3! However, the WG TDFG agreed to re-vitalize the activities through the Online Discussion Forum.
